Presenting this item were John Baker, Project Executive of Swinerton Management and Consulting, and Eric Glass of Glass Architects.

John Baker gave an overview of the last few months. He explained that the current cost estimates will be over by about 12%. He then went through and described the work changes since 2006. He advised that the next step should be to include a workshop to look at possible cost savings in the areas of HVAC, plumbing, electrical and/or structural modifications.

At Councilmember Kelly's request, Mr. Baker explained the contingencies for the project.

Eric Glass explained the architect's side of the costs and what is affecting these costs. He also explained that some of the added cost values are due to Council's desire to go for "certified" green buildings.

Mr. Glass explained that the architects are ready to begin construction drawings tomorrow; however, the value engineering could cause a delay. He suggested that they could come back to Council for direction after the value engineering process takes place. He felt that this would only add about two weeks to the project timeline – worse case scenario would be four weeks. At this point, there could be concern if the start of construction begins to slip to September.

Council discussion followed on some of the specific things that had caused the cost overrides. Noted were such items as soil conditions, retaining wall issues, crossing utilities under Caledonia and the foundation system for the fire building.

Public Comment: There was no public comment.

Councilmember Leone wanted to know if one of the buildings was creating more of the cost override. Mr. Baker noted that it was the Police building, and that was because of the soils condition.

Councilmember Kelly did not believe that there would be much of a savings found following the value engineering process, and suggested moving ahead concurrently.

Vice Mayor Albritton suggested that the sidewalk improvements could come out of another budget. He also was in favor of moving forward, and try and figure out other ways to cover some of the costs.

Mayor Belser agreed that time is money and that any delay would cost.

It was the consensus of the Council to move ahead concurrently, having drawings prepared at the same time that the value engineering process takes place.

Vice Mayor Albritton moved, seconded by Councilmember Kelly to approve the design development documents for the Sausalito public safety buildings and authorize Glass Architects to proceed into the construction documents phase. The motion was unanimously approved by voice vote.
