**SUBJECT:** FY 2013-14 Prioritized Project List

## Background

In the past five years the City Council has approved "Prioritized Project Lists" which prioritized staff work on over 50 projects during the respective fiscal years. The Prioritized Project List approved by the Council in May 2012 for FY 2012-13 is provided as the attached **Exhibit**.

#### Suggestions for Upcoming Prioritized Project List

As part of the upcoming budget discussions, City staff is seeking suggestions from commissions, City volunteers, and the public on projects which should be placed on the FY 2013-14 Prioritized Project List.

In order to qualify as a Prioritized Project List item, the project must:

- Require at least 40 hours of staff time;
- Be one time in nature;
- Not reflect routine provisions of City services;
- Be a mandate imposed by state or federal government, or other funding agencies; or
- Be a major capital improvement.

#### Request

Staff requests the Trees & Views Committee (TVC) take the following actions:

- 1. Review the projects on the current Prioritized Project List (see Exhibit) and last year's TVC suggestion to update the Trees and Views Regulations;
- 2. Suggest any additional projects; and
- 3. Rank the projects.

Staff will forward the TVC's ranked list to the City Council for consideration in setting staff priorities.
