Housing Element Implementation: Vertical Mixed Use Regulations Regarding Residential Uses in the CC, CR and CN Zoning Districts Municipal Code Amendments (ZOA 14-007)

RECOMMENDED ACTION

Staff recommends the City Council waive the second reading, read by title only and adopt "An Ordinance of the City Council of the City of Sausalito to Encourage and Incentivize the Development of Residential Uses above Commercial Uses Within the CC, CR And CN-1 Zoning Districts" (Attachment)

SUMMARY

The attached ordinance implements Housing Element Program 8a "Vertical Mixed Use Requirements in Commercial Districts" to encourage and incentivize the development of residential uses above commercial uses within the CC, CR and CN-1 zoning districts (see **Attachment**).

BACKGROUND

On July 15, 2104 the City Council conducted a public hearing and received public testimony on the Vertical Mixed Use Regulations Ordinance. At the public hearing the Council voted 4:1 (Pfeifer, No) to introduce the ordinance for the Vertical Mixed Use Regulations and continue the hearing to July 22, 2014 (see **Attachment**).

FISCAL IMPACT

No fiscal impacts are anticipated.

RECOMMENDATION

Staff recommends the City Council waive the second reading, read by title only and adopt "An Ordinance of the City Council of the City of Sausalito to Encourage and Incentivize the Development of Residential Uses above Commercial Uses Within the CC, CR And CN-1 Zoning Districts" (Attachment)

28	WHEREAS, Section 10.80.070 allows for amendments of the Zoning Ordinance
29	(Title 10 of the Sausalito Municipal Code) whenever the City Council determines that

43	WHEREAS, on July 15, 2014 and July 22, 2014 City Council conducted a duly-
44 45	noticed public hearings at which time all interested persons were given an opportunity to be

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WHEREAS, adoption of the Vertical Mixed Use Amendments is consistent with the General Plan Program 8a of the Housing Element regarding vertical mixed use housing and Housing Element Policy HE-2.1 regarding variety of housing choices, Policy HE-2.3 regarding adaptive reuse, Policy HE-4.2 regarding flexible development standards, Policy 5.3 regarding family housing, Policy HE-6.5 regarding jobs/housing balance and Land Use Policy LU-2.5 regarding commercial/residential conflict, Policy LU-2.8 regarding upper floor residential uses, and Policy LU-2.12 regarding neighborhood commercial uses.

THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF SAUSALITO DOES HEREBY ORDAIN AS FOLLOWS:

<u>Section 1.</u> Section 10.44.190 of the Sausalito Municipal Code is hereby amended to read as follows:

10.44.190 Residential Use in Commercial Districts

A. Purpose and Applicability. Residential uses located in CC, CR and CN zoning districts are subject to the requirements of this section, as provided by Section 10.24.030 (Allowable Land Uses, Commercial Zoning Districts). In addition to the general purposes of this Chapter, the specific purposes of regulating residential uses in commercial zones are as follows:

1. To further the objectives of the 1985 Traffic Initiative by prohibiting conversion of existing residential uses to commercial uses; and

To provide valuable opportunities for affordable housing while locating residential land uses adjacent to active commercial areas, to implement the goals and policies of the General Plan and specific programs in the Housing Element.

To encourage the retention of existing residential uses in the Central

3. To encourage the retention of existing residential uses in the Central Commercial (CC), Mixed Commercial and Residential (CR), and Neighborhood Commercial (CN-1) Zoning Districts, by prohibiting the conversion of existing upper story residential units to commercial uses.

4. To encourage a mix of residential and commercial uses in the Central Commercial (CC), Mixed Commercial and Residential (CR) and Neighborhood Commercial (CN-1) Zoning Districts, by retaining commercial use on the first (ground or street) levels and requiring that residential use is the only allowed use on all levels above the ground level in the mixed use commercial districts, as specified in this section.

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1 2. Requirements. Each of the following requirements shall be met as a part of 2 any residential project, including new construction and/or conversion of 3 existing building space: 4 Developments of 1 (one) to 5 (five) units must provide a minimum 5 of one (1) Affordable Unit. Developments with six (6) or more 6 units shall require at least twenty (20) percent of the units as 7 affordable. When the number of Affordable Units is calculated to a 8 fractional number, any fraction of less than 0.5 shall rounded down 9 to the next whole number; any fraction of 0.5 or greater shall be 10 rounded up to the next whole number. In the event that the 11 Affordable Unit(s) are rental unit(s) the applicant shall enter into an agreement with the City regarding such unit(s). The agreement 12 shall meet the requirements of California Civil Code Section 13 14 1954.52(b). 15 b. Affordable Units made available as rentals shall be provided to low 16 income (80% AMI) households at an affordable rent. 17 Affordable Units made available as ownership units shall be sold c. 18 to moderate income (120% AMI) households at an Affordable 19 Ownership Housing Cost. Purchasers of Affordable Units must 20 remain as owner-occupants, and may not rent or lease the unit, 21 unless written approval is first obtained from the Director. The 22 Director may approve the renting or leasing only if all of the 23 following conditions are met: (1) the term is not greater than 24 twelve (12) months and cannot be extended without the Director's 25 written approval; (2) the owner demonstrates to the Director's 26 reasonable satisfaction that the owner will incur substantial 27 hardship if he or she is not permitted to rent or lease the Property 28 or any part thereof to a third party; and (3) the rent does not exceed 29 the lesser of: (i) thirty percent (30%) of the income of the tenant 30 household that is renting the Property, or (ii) the owner's monthly 31 cost of principal and interest on the First Mortgage Loan and any 32 Second Mortgage Loan, and property insurance and property taxes 33 associated with Property. Affordable Units shall be constructed to 34 include a minimum of two (2) bedrooms in order to accommodate 35 families. Affordable Units shall be constructed to include a 36 minimum of two (2) bedrooms in order to accommodate families. 37 Affordable Units must be deed-restricted for a period of not less d. 38 than forty (40) years. 39

Incentives. The following incentives and conditions shall be granted to

developers of residential projects under this Section 10.44.190:

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1 2 3		a.	Development may permit commercial and residential tenants to share parking, and for tandem and off-site parking leases with a Minor Use Permit. In order to approve a Minor Use Permit for
4			joint use, the Applicant shall demonstrate the following:
5			i. There is no substantial conflict in the principal operating hours
6			of the building or uses for which the joint use of off-street
7			parking facilities is proposed; and
8			parting facilities is proposed, and
9			ii. The proposed joint use parking area is conveniently located to
10			the uses to be served.
11			
12			iii. If the area to be used for parking and the parcel on which the
13			subject land use is located are not the same, then the Zoning
14			Administrator shall consider whether a deed restriction is
15			warranted as a condition of approval. Said deed restriction
16			would stipulate that the shared parking agreement shall remain
17			in effect for the life of the subject land use.
18			
19		b.	Affordable Units may be permitted to be smaller in aggregate size
20			and have different interior finishes and features within reason from
21			market-rate units. The interior amenities in Affordable Units
22			should generally be the same as those of the market rate units in
23			the project. Appliances need not be the same make, model, or type
24			of such item as long as they are of good and new quality and are
25			consistent with current standards for housing. Deviations between
26			market rate and Affordable Units shall be described in writing by
27			the applicant and shall require written approval by the Director.
28			
29		c.	Development and application fees, including plan check and
30			building permit fees, shall be reduced to a rate of 50 percent of the
31			adopted development fees for the affordable portions of the
32			project. The fee reduction shall be calculated on pro-rata basis by
33			the Director.

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5. Exceptions to Requirements. Waiver of specific use requirements in this Section 10.44.190 pursuant to Section 10.44.010.E shall only be considered in the following two instances:

- a. To allow for an exception to Section 10.44.190.B.1, which requires that all uses located above the first (street or ground) level of all existing and new structures shall be residential, to allow for upper level commercial uses. The expansion of an existing business within the same or adjacent site, or the allowance of small commercial uses (up to a maximum 1,000 square feet per parcel) may be special situations considered by the Planning Commission when evaluating an exception to Section 10.44.190.B.1.
- b. To allow for an exception to Section 10.44.010.E, which requires that Affordable Units provide a minimum of two (2) bedrooms. To receive an exception from Section 10.44.010.E, it must be demonstrated that there are physical site constraints which make infeasible units with two or more bedrooms whether affordable or market rate.

Section 10.44.010.E shall not be used to grant any other exceptions from this Chapter 10.44.190 except for the two instances listed above.
