2. ZOA 14-007, Housing Element Implementation Programs, City of Sausalito, Citywide. Housing Element Implementation Zoning Ordinance Amendments including: Special Needs Housing – modifications to Municipal Code Section 10.28, Table 10.20-1 and the Zoning Map pursuant to State Law to create an "Emergency Shelter Overlay Zoning District" to allow emergency homeless shelters, transitional and supportive housing; and Vertical Mixed Use Regulations -- modifications to Municipal Code Section 10.44.190 (Residential Use in Commercial Districts) to require that residential use only is permitted on all levels above the street level in the Central Commercial (Council), Commercial Residential (CR) and Neighborhood Commercial (CN-1) Zoning Districts.

Chair Cox moved to recommend City Council approval of Municipal Code Amendments to allow Special Needs Housing, subject to the following amendments:

- 1. The Emergency Shelter Overlay shall include only Public Institutional zoned sites that are owned by the City of Sausalito or the Sausalito School District with deletion of the Spencer Avenue Fire Station (Station 2).
- 2. Include the recommended amendments to the ordinance enunciated on Page 7 of Ed McCann's letter regarding limitations on the number of nights, requiring Sausalito residency, and availability of beds on a first-come, first-served basis.
- Subsection I.2 on Page 8 of the Ordinance regarding length of stay
 extensions should include wording to allow an extension if an emergency
 shelter resident could demonstrate acceptance into a residential
 treatment program for which the admission date has not yet arrived (if
 applicable).

Chair Cox amended the motion to state that instead of recommending Amendment 2, it is recommended that staff explore the feasibility of Amendment 2 about the provision by a prospective emergency shelter resident of some

method of demonstrating some nexus to Sausalito and then with staff providing its final recommendation to the City Council on that issue.

Commissioner Nichols seconded the amended motion.

The motion passed 3-0.

Commissioner Nichols moved and Commissioner Cleveland-Knowles seconded a motion to recommend City Council approval of Municipal Code Amendments regarding the Vertical Mixed Use regulations (ZOA 14-007).

The motion passed 3-0.

The public hearing was closed.
