

Measure F: Sausalito Park Improvement/Safety Measure Questions and Answers

Q: What is Measure F?

A: The Sausalito Park Improvement/Safety Measure (Measure F) authorizes the City to proceed with a previously-approved financing plan for essential improvements and upgrades to the City's deteriorating parks – specifically Robin Sweeny, Southview, and Dunphy parks and the MLK site through a common public financing mechanism used by scores of cities and other public agencies throughout California. Measure F will <u>not</u> raise any existing taxes, nor will it establish any new taxes.

Q: How would Measure F address the needs of local parks?

A: Parks give children safe places to play – keeping them focused and out of trouble – and provide seniors with space for exercise and recreation. However, Sausalito's parks are old, deteriorating and need significant repairs and safety upgrades. Measure F would bring our parks up to today's safety codes and standards, improve playgrounds, add restrooms, and restore wetlands, all with <u>no</u> increase in taxes. As well-used public spaces, our parks contribute to our beautiful community and local property values.

Q: What specific park improvements would be made?

- A: Measure F would improve Robin Sweeny, Southview, and Dunphy parks and the MLK site by making the following repairs now, before they become more expensive to make in the future:
 - Bringing parks up to current safety standards
 - Replacing unsafe playground equipment
 - Upgrading safety lighting
 - Adding needed restrooms
 - Repairing leaky roofs, deteriorating buildings, and hillside retaining walls
 - Improving play courts and sports fields
 - Restoring wetlands and natural areas

Q: Why was this placed on the ballot?

A: Placing this Measure on the November ballot allows the City to expeditiously and transparently move forward with a fiscally prudent financing option for improving our deteriorating parks, without raising taxes, which residents have said is a top priority for them.

Q: When is the election?

A: Tuesday, November 3, 2015.
