San Francisco Man Arrested for Warrants and Possession of Stolen Property in Sausalito

On Sunday, 2-10-19, Sausalito Police Officers received multiple calls from residents regarding a homeless looking man with bare feet covered in mud, walking onto properties and looking into parked vehicles. Officers stopped and contacted Mark Kelley, age 38, out of San Francisco. A warrant check showed that Kelley had an outstanding misdemeanor warrant out of San Francisco. Officers did not believe that Kelley was being honest about his purpose or intentions of walking around the hills of Sausalito sightseeing. Kelley was subsequently transported to Marin County Jail to be booked for the warrant.

While Kelley was being booked at Marin County Jail, Sausalito Police Officers were investigating a recovered stolen vehicle that was located in the 600 block of Bridgeway. During the investigation, officers noticed a distinct odor that they recognized to be similar to the odor that Kelley was emitting. The investigating officer then inquired about the vehicle keys that were stolen with the vehicle. The vehicle owner described the keys and the officer recognized the description of the keys as the same keys that were located in Kelley's possession. Through photographs, the vehicle owner was able to positively identify the keys. Additional stolen property found in Kelley's possession was identified as being stolen from a second victim vehicle.

Kelley was booked into the Marin County Jail on an outstanding warrant and possession of stolen property.

The apprehension of Kelley and the subsequent investigation would not have been possible without the diligent observations of Sausalito residents. The Sausalito Police Department would like to encourage Sausalito residents to continue to call the police department regarding any suspicious person or suspicious activity they observe.
