Package Theft Leads To Arrest

On Tuesday, April 28, 2020, at approximately 4:00 PM, Sausalito Police Officers were dispatched to the 200 block of San Carlos in regards to a theft that had just occurred. A witness reported that she saw two individuals exit a champagne colored sedan and steal two packages from her neighbor's front door. One of the suspects was described as a Hispanic female, in her twenties, with dark hair, and wearing a zip-up hoodie jacket.

Shortly after being dispatched to the call, Officer Honour Knudsen and Officer Edgar Padilla located a champagne colored Buick. A check on the Buick's registration indicated that it had been suspended as of January 2020. Officers made a traffic stop on the vehicle in the 2600 block of Bridgeway. During the traffic stop, Officers noticed that one of the occupants in the vehicle matched the description of one of the people who had been observed taking the packages. A records check revealed that all the occupants of the vehicle were on probation with search and seizure clauses. Officers conducted a search of the vehicle and located the contents of the stolen packages (dog toys), metal knuckles, suspected methamphetamine, narcotics paraphernalia, leather gloves, a bb gun, and a wig.

Bernave CARRASCO, a 48 year old resident of Vacaville, was arrested for possession of metal knuckles and possession of narcotics paraphernalia. Andrea MCGOLDRICK, a 22 year old resident of Napa, was arrested for possession of suspected methamphetamine. CARRASCO and MCGOLDRICK were issued a citation and released from the scene. A complaint request will be sent to the Marin County District Attorney requesting that CARRASCO and MCGOLDRICK along with the two other passengers in the vehicle (Angelique Molina, a 24 year old resident of Napa and Marco CABRERA, a 25 year old resident of Fairfield) be charged with conspiracy as well.

The victim of the theft declined to press charges.
