Re: Fire Conditions of Approval for the Publicly Accessible Tennis Courts on APN 063-110-17

The Southern Marin Fire District (SMFD) Prevention Division has reviewed the above listed address. Based on City of Sausalito Municipal Code and the provisions of the 2019 California Fire Code (CFC) as adopted with amendments by the SMFD Ordinance No. 2019/2020-1, the following conditions shall apply to this plan review. Please note that fire department Ordinance and fire prevention standards are available on the <u>District's website</u> and can be located in Fire Prevention found under Our District.

Although our plan review is comprehensive and intended to be complete, non-compliant elements and conditions may occasionally be overlooked, or some elements may lack clarity, or an element may be misrepresented on the submitted plans. Please be aware non-compliant elements and conditions not addressed in plan review are subject to field review, and compliance with all applicable codes and laws will be required based on the results of the onsite inspection.

## **Project Description:**

Preliminary review of the site by the City of Sausalito Building Official indicates that the intended use was not
within the definitions of the Building Code as an occupancy, structure, or building. Following the determination
by the City Building Official, the area has been indicated to have no formal classification from either the
California Fire Code or the California Building Code. The City Building official has reviewed and approved the
areas exiting and the Fire Department's review will primarily focus on the safe access to the area for emergency
response. The approved plans indicate that multiple exit doors will be maintained open and clear at all times.

## This review was found to be complete. The following conditions shall be applied to this project:

- 1. Fire Inspection Required: A HOLD HAS BEEN PLACED ON THE FINAL INSPECTION FOR THE FIRE DISTRICT TO INSPECT THE AREA FOR SAFE ACCESS FOR EMERGENCY PERSONEL.
- 2. Designated Kitchen Area requirements: The designated kitchen area described in the reviewed plans are to always meet the minimum requirements.

Open burning requirements under Section 307 of the 2019 California Fire Code:

- a. **307.1.1 Prohibited Open Burning** Open burning shall be prohibited when atmospheric conditions or local circumstances make such fires hazardous.
- b. **307.2.1 Authorization** Where required by state or local law or regulations, open burning shall only be permitted with prior approval from the state or local air and water quality management authority, provided that all conditions specified in the authorization are followed.
- c. **307.4.2 Recreational Fires** Recreational fires shall not be conducted within 25 feet (7620 mm) of a structure or combustible material. Conditions that could cause a fire to spread within 25 feet (7620 mm) of a structure shall be eliminated prior to ignition.
- d. **307.5 Attendance** Open burning/recreational fires and use of portable outdoor fireplaces shall be constantly attended until the fire is extinguished. Not fewer than one portable fire extinguisher complying with Section 906 with a minimum 4-A rating. (Within 75 feet of travel).
- e. **SMC 12.04.010 Outdoor fires Conditions of issuance**: The SMFD's conditions of issuance, as defined as the Sausalito Fire Departments official designee, requires that all **recreational fires**, as defined below, are maintained in established non-combustible receptacles designed to limit the fuel area.

See below as defined in Chapter 2 of the 2019 CFC:

**RECREATIONAL FIRE**. An outdoor fire burning materials other than rubbish where the fuel being burned is not contained in an incinerator, outdoor fireplace, portable outdoor fireplace, barbeque grill or barbeque pit and has a total fuel area of 3 feet (914 mm) or less in diameter and 2 feet (610 mm) or less in height for pleasure, religious, ceremonial, cooking, warmth or similar purposes.

**Note**: It is unlawful for any person(s) to use open burning for the purpose of burning trash under Sausalito Municipal Code 12.24.070-12.24.080 subject to penalty under 12.04.020.

- 3. Any construction on this site shall comply with California Fire Code Chapter 33 Fire Safety During Construction and Demolition. These requirements include but are not limited to: Temporary Heating Equipment, Precautions Against Fire, Flammable and Combustible Liquids, Flammable Gases, Owners Responsibility for Fire Protection, Fire Reporting, Access for Fire Fighting, Means of Egress, Water Supply for Fire Protection, Standpipes, Automatic Fire Sprinkler Systems, Portable Fire Extinguishers, Motorized Construction Equipment, and Safeguarding Roofing Operations.
- 4. Fire access to the area as well as the other surrounding properties shall be maintained at all times. Unapproved restrictions in roadway access shall result in citations and vehicles being towed at the owner's expense.

Any revisions that include additional or reduction of the area, or modifications to existing or new walls, floors, ceilings, or roofs shall be submitted as revised drawings to the Fire Department for further review.

All on-site improvements must be submitted and reviewed prior to additional fire clearance(s).

Final occupancy approval shall remain with the City of Sausalito's Building Official.
