SUMMARY

The Sausalito Police Department is prepared to address the Sausalito City Council with statistical information concerning crime and traffic issues that have occurred in the City of Sausalito. This statistical information covers all data collected through the third quarter of the 2024 calendar year.

BACKGROUND

The Sausalito Police Department documents criminal and traffic statistics in a format that is consistent with the State of California Department of Justice guidelines. The Sausalito Police Department submits this statistical data to the Sausalito City Council quarterly.

USE OF FORCE INCIDENTS-Q3

In Q3, the Sausalito Police Department reported one Use of Force incident. This involved an officer drawing a Taser to gain compliance from a suspect who had attempted a stabbing and was still armed with a knife at the time of police contact. Although the Taser was aimed at the suspect, it was not deployed. The suspect was taken into custody without further incident, and no injuries occurred as a result.

SIGNIFICANT POLICY CHANGES

The Sausalito Police Department added Policy #401- Bias-Based Policing to our Policy Manual. This policy provides guidance to department members that affirms the Sausalito Pollice Department's commitment to policing that is fair and objective.

PERSONNEL UPDATES

The Sausalito Police Department currently has three open police officer positions and is allotted one backfill position.

During quarter #3, the Department had fourteen applicants for the recruit officer position, four academy graduate applicants, and one lateral applicant. Two of the fourteen recruit officers were given conditional job offers. The two candidates given conditional job officers were disqualified early in the background process. All four of the academy graduate applicants were disqualified for background-related issues. The one lateral applicant did not show up for his scheduled interview.

The Department is currently in the hiring process for the Administrative Aide position that is expected to be vacant October 31, 2024. There were fifty-nine applicants for this position. Eight of the fifty-nine candidates were interviewed. Three of the eight passed a skills test and a second interview. The top candidate was offered the position and is currently going through the background process.

HIRING

Parking Enforcement Officer Peter Flores was hired on August 19, 2024, and is currently completing his training program.


Officer James Angelopulos graduated from the basic police academy on August 23, 2024, and started with the Police Department on August 26, 2024. Officer Angelopulos is currently in the field training program.

Officer Branden Chao was released from the police officer field training program on September 11, 2024. On September 17, 2024, Branden Chao accepted the position of Parking Enforcement Officer and is currently completing his training program.

Police Community Service and Evidence Technician Michael Brand was hired on September 23, 2024, and is currently completing his training program.

PROGRAMS AND PROJECTS

<u>Community Trading Card Challenge:</u> The Sausalito Police Department launched this fun and engaging way for the community to connect with our team. 


<u>Bias By Proxy Campaign:</u> The Sausalito Police Department has implemented policies and training to help officers identify and disrupt Bias by Proxy when responding to calls. Dispatchers at the Marin County Sheriff's Office Communications Center have been trained to flag and screen for bias-based calls. However, our community also plays a crucial role in preventing Bias by Proxy from happening in the first place.

Three Considerations: To help prevent Bias by Proxy, the Sausalito Police Department encourages everyone to use a simple tool: the "Three Considerations" before contacting the police.

- 1. **Consider the Behavior**: Do I see behavior that makes me think someone is committing a crime or endangering someone?
- 2. **Consider your Assumptions**: If a friend or neighbor were acting the same way, would I think someone should call the police?
- 3. **Consider your Reaction**: Are the police the most appropriate service providers for the situation?

If the answer to any of these questions is "No," consider calling other service providers. Remember, a person's race or appearance is NEVER a good reason to call the police.
