

AGENDA TITLE:

Non-motorized Transportation Pilot Program – Technical Advisory Committee

RECOMMENDED ACTION:

Adopt motion approving membership structures and rules of operation.

SUMMARY

The City was awarded three grants from the Non-Motorized Transportation Pilot Program for Stairs, Improvements between the Ferry Landing and Bridgeway, and for a Plan from the Ferry Landing to Gate 6 Road.

Some or all of these projects could benefit from a community oversight committee to guide plan development. A technical advisory committee was proposed as part of the Ferry Landing to Gate 6 Road Path Project.

A Technical Advisory Committee structure is proposed for Council consideration as directed at the March 10, 2009 Council Meeting when the Ferry Landing to Gate 6 Road Path Project was awarded to Alta Planning.

Staff recommends that the Council adopt a motion approving committee structure and rules.

BACKGROUND

Technical Advisory Committee

At the February 24, 2009 Council meeting discussion occurred regarding the structure of a proposed Technical Advisory Committee to oversee NMTPP project development. Two options were briefly considered:

1. Forming a new committee

2. Using the currently authorized but dormant Pedestrian and Bicycle Advisory Committee.

There appeared to be a consensus to not use the still authorized Bicycle and Pedestrian Task Force. The Alta Proposal did not provide detailed structure for the Committee. Based on the comments offered while these projects were recently considered, Staff suggests the structure be as follows:

- 1. City Council Representative
- 2. Member of Transportation Action Committee
- 3. Member of the Waterfront and Marinship Committee
- 4. Pedestrian Advocate, City residence mandatory
- 5. Bicycle Advocate, City residence mandatory
- 6. Marin County Public Works Staff (to guide planning from the North City Limit to Gate 6 Road, 500 feet north).
- 7. 1 representative, Transportation Alternatives of Marin (targeted member, Patrick Seidler)/
- 8. 1 member from Marin County Bicycle Coalition
- 9. 1 interested Business Operator (targeted member Downtown Merchant/Chamber)

Rules:

Section 2.58 of the Municipal Code provides some basis for this committee. Due to the fact that the Path Project has a component outside the City Limit, full compliance with this section may not be appropriate. Proposed rules are defined on the attached draft information sheet.

FISCAL IMPACT

This item has no direct costs to the City General Fund. Staff time and consultant time will be required to serve the committee. Consultant costs are borne by the Project grant. Staff costs are currently consider part of normal operations of the Engineering Staff. `

STAFF RECOMMENDATIONS

Adopt a motion approving the structure and rules of the Sausalito Non-Motorized Transportation Pilot Program Technical Advisory Committee as shown and described on the attached Committee information sheet.

Alternatively the Council could approve alternative structure. In that case staff recommends that the Council provide direction on acceptable structure and rules.

Alternatively the Council can take no action, which will result in no creation of a technical advisory committee. In such case staff will provide consultant direction. Other feedback will be provided in special community meetings or regular meetings of the Planning Commission and/or the City Council.
