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Ms Wagner then described the suggested penalties as \$400 per day (maximum \$24,000 during first 60-day period) for projects extending over the limit for 60 days; \$600 per day (maximum \$36,000 during this 60-day period) for projects extending over the limit from the 61st day through the 120th day; and \$800 per day (to a maximum of the lesser of 10% of the project value or \$200,000) for those projects extending over 121 days and thereafter.

Council questions followed.

## **Public Comment:**

Chuck Donald noted that the City would never get around all of these problems, but he thought this was a good start. He also felt very strongly that the property owner should be the one assessed with the penalties.

Michael Rex spoke on several issues. He addressed concerns about the construction duration, appeal process and discretionary reviews.

There being no additional public comment, Mayor Leone closed the public hearing.

Council then went through suggested changes to the draft ordinance which the Planning Commission would need to reconsider.

It was the consensus of the Council to return the draft ordinance to the Planning Commission in order to review Council's suggested changes.

## **BUSINESS ITEMS**

Monthly Public Safety Facilities Project Update (Director of Public Works Jonathon Goldman, Project Manager Loren Umbertis)

Project Manager Loren Umbertis presented an update on the Public Safety Facilities Project. He noted that with regards to completion, the project was approximately 50% of time complete and 35% of dollars spent. Mr. Umbertis further noted that the detention area was currently under design by Glass Architects, and that they would return on July 21 to address the associated change orders.

## **Public Comment:**

Pat Zuch suggested that the community needs to be kept more informed in what is happening with this project and suggested using the In the Loop for updates.

When asked by the Mayor, Mr. Umbertis noted that the anticipated construction completion date would be sometime in February 2010.

## 6B. Appointment of a designated representative and two alternates to the Marin Emergency Radio Authority Board of Directors (Police Captain John Rohrbacher)

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Police Captain John Rohrbacher gave a brief overview of the staff report. He noted that staff was suggesting that a Councilmember be named as the designated representative and that Chief Paulin and Captain Rohrbacher be named as alternates.

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**Public Comment:** There was no Public Comment on this item.

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Councilmember Kelly moved, seconded by Vice Mayor Weiner, to adopt Resolution No. 5044 appointing Jonathan Leone as the designated representative and Chief Paulin and Captain Rohrbacher as the alternates to the Marin Emergency Radio Authority (MERA) Board of Directors. The motion was unanimously approved by a voice vote.

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6C. Amendments to the Master Fee Schedule; including proposed fee changes for Parks and Recreation, Library and Police (Parks and Recreation Director Mike Langford)

Parks and Recreation Director Mike Langford presented the staff report on this item. He reviewed the changes in fees and explained why staff was recommending the changes.

There was no Public Comment on this item.

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Council questions followed.

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Councilmember Kelly moved, seconded by Vice Mayor Weiner, to adopt Resolution No. 5045 approving the Master Fee Schedule for changes in fees in the Parks and Recreation Department, the Police Department/Parking Division and the Library. The

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6D Discussion on Closed Session Reporting (City Attorney Mary Wagner)

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City Attorney Mary Wagner presented the staff report on this item. She quoted from the Section 54950 of the California Government Code, or more commonly known as "The Brown Act", explaining the limitations on what can be discussed during Closed Sessions. She then explained what is required to be reported out following the Closed Session, quoting several Government Code Sections.

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**Public Comment:** 

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Carolyn Ford, spoke, representing Sausalito Environmental Action (SEA). She noted the petition being circulated by SEA and that they had over 500 signatures stressing a need for "open government". Ms Ford advised that SEA has two questions for Council: 1) Can the City Council vote to disclose this information after a period of time has passed; and 2) Can that discussion take place in an open session.
