

AGENDA TITLE:

Non-motorized Transportation Pilot Program – Technical Advisory Committee

RECOMMENDED ACTION:

Adopt motion approving membership structures and rules of operation.

SUMMARY

The City was awarded a grant from the Non-Motorized Transportation Pilot Program to develop a project scoping plan for a Multi-use Path from the Ferry Landing to Gate 6 Road. The Plan is useful for seeking construction grant funding from State and Federal transportation programs. Funds are needed to replace an older no-longer standard and deteriorating path along parts of Bridgeway and to construct new paths and connections to form a continuous route from the Ferry Landing to Gate 6 Road.

The City hired Alta Planning to develop the plan. Alta proposed creating a Technical Advisory Committee (TAC) to oversee the development of the Plan. The Council approved a TAC structure on April 7. Open solicitations for volunteers have been made.

The Council is requested to review the proposed membership. Staff recommends that the Council adopt a motion approving the proposed committee membership.

DISCUSSION

A Roster is attached identifying proposed volunteers, the roster also summarizes the operational parameters of the Committee.

Committee membership was achieved by a combination of notices in the Outlook and Community Newspapers as well as direct outreach.

The Council Member position remains vacant as of the date of this report. It is expected that the Council will decide on appointing a Council representative during the consideration of this item.

The Non-motorized Transportation Pilot program is an experiment. Policy makers in Marin County and in Washington are in need of results soon. The desire is that the Path Plan and other Non-motorized Pilot Program Projects/Programs be completed in late 2009 to early 2010. Success of these projects and programs will be determined through the evaluation of transportation mode shift. If success is achieved it is expected that future Federal and State Transportation Program funds will include regular programs to develop and extend facilities and programs for sustainable transportation.

FISCAL IMPACT

This item adds no new costs to the City General Fund. Consultant costs are borne by the Project grant. Staff costs are currently considered part of normal operations of the Engineering Staff. Supplies needed for the Committee operation will be borne by a combination of grant reimbursable sources and Engineering Division operations accounts.

STAFF RECOMMENDATIONS

Adopt a motion approving membership to the Bridgeway Path Plan Technical Advisory Committee.

Alternatively the Council could approve alternative membership.

Alternatively the Council can take no action. In such case staff seeks Council direction on next steps.
