

AGENDA TITLE:

Transportation Authority of Marin Return to Source Grant.

RECOMMENDED ACTION:

Execute an Agreement with Transportation Authority of Marin

SUMMARY

Voters in Marin approved Measure A in November of 2004. The Transportation Authority of Marin was formed to administer Measure A. The Measure included "return to source" funds for local transportation improvement programs. These funds are allocated annually by the Transportation Authority of Marin (TAM). TAM has prepared Amendment No. 2 to Funding Agreement 2007-013 with Sausalito, to enable the disbursement of return to source funds for Fiscal Years 2008/09 and 2009/10 for a total of \$134,737.

Staff recommends the Council adopt a resolution authorizing the City Manager to execute Amendment No. 2 to TAM Agreement #2007-013.

BACKGROUND

Voters in Marin approved Measure A in November of 2004. Transportation Authority of Marin was created to administer Measure A. Measure "A" included "Return to Source" funds for local transportation improvement programs. Sausalito received a first disbursement in 2008 for \$65,997. Sausalito received a second disbursement in 2009 for of \$75,274. TAM has prepared Amendment No. 2 to enable a third disbursement of funds to Sausalito of \$134,737. This amount was determined using a formula that was weighted 50% based upon population and 50% based upon street mileage.

To obtain these funds the City must execute an agreement with the Transportation Authority of Marin. TAM has prepared an Agreement Amendment No. 2 to enable funds disbursement.

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ISSUES

The funds must be used for transportation purposes including street and roads projects, local transit projects, bicycle projects, and pedestrian projects. The Sausalito Budget programmed \$50,000 of TAM funds for the Street Repair Program and \$47,000 for NMTPP Bridgeway to Ferry Landing Design Costs. The remaining amounts are expected to go into Measure A Fund fund balances. Programming of those amounts are expected to be deliberated on in coming months with the preparation of the budget for next year and in the process of awarding contracts for transportation projects.

The agreement outlines conditions for the funds, including:

record keeping financial reporting, compliance with environmental regulations, acknowledging the source of the funds on transportation projects. Using the funds only on eligible expenses

These requirements are typical to assure openness and "transparency" with regard to the use of the funds.

This program is an annual program. Is it reasonable to grant staff an ongoing authorization to execute this and future amendments to speed disbursement of Measure A funds to the City? Staff believes so but defers analysis and deliberation of this matter to the Council.

FISCAL IMPACT

Approving this item provides additional revenue for transportation projects. TAM's policy is to hold return to source allocations until the local agency has made claim to them. Annual Claims have not occurred for various reasons including belief that the funds need to be expended in a timely manner and staff vacancies limiting the ability to prepare documents to make claims for the funds and more importantly, develop project documents to expend the funds. Engineering is now staffed to budgeted levels and have been able to begin to address a backlog of activities including Capital Improvement Projects and making claims to Measure A funds.

The monies must be used for eligible transportation projects. Staff recommends that the funds be held for use for transportation projects in the General Capital Projects Fund and/or in the most current Ten Year Capital Improvement Plan. Measure A funds will provide financial augmentation of the identified programs and projects.

WHEREAS, the voters in Marin County approved Measure A in November of 2004 creating a 0.5% sales tax to fund transportation improvements in the County, and

WHEREAS, the provisions in Measure A provide additional revenues to Marin County Communities to augment transportation activities; and

WHEREAS, the Transportation Authority of Marin (TAM) was formed to administer Measure A proceeds which has prepared an agreement to enable disbursement of funds to the City of Sausalito for local transportation programs; and

WHEREAS, the terms and conditions of the disbursement are detailed in TAM Agreement #2007-013 which the City Council approved in December of 2006; and

WHEREAS, the TAM Agreement #2007-013 is amended from time to time to provide additional disbursements to the City of Sausalito.

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AMENDMENT NO. 2 TO FUNDING AGREEMENT 2007-013 BY AND BETWEEN THE TRANSPORTATION AUTHORITY OF MARIN AND THE CITY OF SAUSALITO

THIS AMENDMENT NO. 2 to Funding Agreement 2007-013 is made and entered into this ______ day of ______ 2009, by and between the Transportation Authority of Marin, hereinafter referred to as "TAM," and the City of Sausalito, hereinafter referred to as "RECIPIENT."

RECITALS:

WHEREAS, TAM and the RECIPIENT entered into Funding Agreement 2007-013 ("AGREEMENT") for allocation of Measure A funds from Strategy 3.2 of the Measure A Strategic Plan to complete work on projects identified as Local Infrastructure for All Modes in the Measure A Expenditure Plan; and

WHEREAS, Section 3 of AGREEMENT obligated RECIPIENT to complete work in accordance to the RECIPIENT's Measure A Sales Tax Program Allocation Request Form; and

WHEREAS, Section 4 to AGREEMENT stipulated the maximum cost to TAM for services to be provided by the RECIPIENT shall not exceed \$141,271, as amended by Amendment No. 1; and

WHEREAS, TAM and RECIPIENT desire to amend AGREEMENT to augment the scope of work and increase the maximum cost to TAM by \$134,737 to complete work identified in EXHIBIT G; and

NOW, THEREFORE, The parties agree to amend AGREEMENT as set forth below.

AGREEMENT:

- A. The parties shall perform under this Amendment upon the same terms and conditions as the AGREEMENT except as amended herein below.
- B. Section 3 of AGREEMENT is hereby amended to read, as follows:

SECTION 3. PROJECT DEFINITION AND SCOPE

This AGREEMENT, approved through TAM Resolutions 2006-14, 2007-16, and 2009-12, in accordance with the requirements of TAM's Measure A Expenditure Plan and Strategic Plan, is made for the funding of the following project ("Project") identified in the RECIPIENT's Measure A Sales Tax Program Allocation Request Form (Attached):

Local Infrastructure for All Modes

Additional information on project scope is included in the Measure A Sales Tax Program Allocation Request Forms.

C. Section 4 of AGREEMENT is hereby amended to read, as follows:

SECTION 4. GRANT

TAM hereby grants to the RECIPIENT the sum of \$65,997 as designated in TAM Resolution No. 2006-14, approved July 27, 2006, \$75,274 as designated in TAM Resolution No. 2007-16, approved July 26, 2007, and \$134,737 as designated in TAM Resolution No. 2009-12, approved June 25, 2009, which are attached as EXHIBITS D, F, and G and are included in this AGREEMENT by reference.

D. Section 34 of AGREEMENT is hereby amended to read, as follows:

RESOLUTION OF THE TRANSPORTATION AUTHORITY OF MARIN FOR THE ALLOCATION OF \$2,482,464 IN MEASURE A, STRATEGY 3.2, FUNDS TO BELVEDERE, CORTE MADERA, FAIRFAX, LARKSPUR, MILL VALLEY, NOVATO, ROSS, SAN ANSELMO, SAN RAFAEL, SAUSALITO, TIBURON, AND MARIN COUNTY

WHEREAS, The voters of Marin County approved the authorization of Measure A at the General Election held on November 2, 2004, thereby authorizing that TAM be given the responsibility to administer the proceeds from a one-half cent transaction and use tax; and

WHEREAS, The duration of the tax will be 20 years from the initial year of collection, which began April 1, 2005, with said tax to terminate on March 31, 2025; and

WHEREAS, The tax proceeds will be used to pay for the programs and projects outlined in TAM's Expenditure Plan; and

WHEREAS, TAM has developed a Strategic Plan to provide guidance on implementing the Expenditure Plan; and

WHEREAS, The Strategic Plan programs Measure A funds over a 20 year period to the four strategies listed in the Expenditure Plan, including Strategy 3.2, Local Infrastructure for all Modes; and

WHEREAS, Measure A funds for Strategy 3.2, Local Infrastructure for all Modes, are programmed under the Strategic Plan to Marin County and the cities or towns of Belvedere, Corte Madera, Fairfax, Larkspur, Mill Valley, Novato, Ross, San Anselmo, San Rafael, Sausalito, and Tiburon for infrastructure improvement projects that are prioritized by the respective Public Works Directors; and

WHEREAS, Measure A funds for Strategy 3.2 can be used for street and road projects, local transit projects, and bicycle and pedestrian projects.

WHEREAS, Infrastructure improvement projects funded with Measure A funds for Strategy 3.2 will be approved by the County's and Cities' governing boards at public meetings, and

WHEREAS, The project sponsors are requesting funds from Strategy 3.2 that have been accumulated for FY 09/10; and

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WHEREAS, These allocations are consistent with the 2009 Measure A Strategic Plan Update; and

WHEREAS. There are sufficient funds in the Strategy 3.2 line item of the TAM's approved FY 09/10 budget to cover the proposed action; and

WHEREAS, After reviewing the request in coordination with project sponsors, TAM staff recommended allocating \$2,482,464 in Measure A funds as requested; now, therefore, be it

RESOLVED. That the Transportation Authority of Marin hereby allocates a total of \$2,482,464 in Measure A funds for eligible projects under Strategy 3.2 for FY 09/10 in the following distributions: \$23,711 for the City of Belvedere, \$79,503 for the Town of Corte Madera, \$64,160 for the Town of Fairfax, \$90,894 for the City of Larkspur, \$129,483 for the City of Mill Valley, \$407,744 for the City of Novato, \$110,484 for the Town of Ross, \$103,214 for the Town of San Anselmo, \$454,934 for the City of San Rafael, \$134,737 for the City of Sausalito. \$79,038 for the Town of Tiburon, and \$804,561 for the County of Marin; and be it further

RESOLVED, That the Transportation Authority of Marin finds the allocations of these funds to be in conformance with the priorities and funding levels established in the Measure A Expenditure Plan and the 2009 Measure A Strategic Plan Update; and be it further

RESOLVED, That the Transportation Authority of Marin hereby authorizes the actual expenditure (cash reimbursement) of funds for these activities to take place subject to the Fiscal Year Cash Flow Distribution Schedule detailed in the attached Allocation Request Forms; and be it further

SECTION 1. RECITALS

- 1. The voters of Marin County, pursuant to the provisions of the Local Transportation Authority and Improvement Act, California Public Utilities Code Section 180000 et seq., approved the authorization of Measure A at the General Election held on November 2, 2004, thereby authorizing that TAM be given the responsibility to administer the proceeds from a one-half cent transaction and use tax.
- 2. by The duration of the tax will be 20 years from the initial year of collection, which began April 1, 2005, with said tax to terminate on March 31, 2025. The states of the said tax to terminate on March 31, 2025, which is the said tax to terminate on March 31, 2025.
- 3. The tax proceeds will be used to pay for the programs and projects outlined in the Measure A Expenditure Plan. The program of the program of the projects outlined in the second of the projects of the project of the projects of the project
- 4. Local streets and roads funds (Funds) are provided, under the Measure A Sales Tax Revenue referendum, to local cities, towns, and Marin County (Local Agency) to be used for any local transportation need identified by the Local Agency's Public Works Director, including streets and roads projects, local transit projects, bicycle pedestrian projects and other transportation uses, as approved by the Local Agency's governing board.
- 5. Each project will be required to consider the needs of all roadway users and, where feasible, locally defined bicycle and pedestrian projects will be implemented at the time a roadway is improved.
- 6. Funds within a geographic sub-area will be allocated to the local agencies within that sub-area based on the Expenditure Plan formula, weighted 50% by the population of the local agency within the sub-area and 50% of the number of road miles with the sub-area.
- 7. Funds will be reallocated every two years based on changes in population and road mile figures.

SECTION 2. PURPOSE OF FUNDING AGREEMENT

This AGREEMENT is entered into by and between TAM and RECIPIENT to document the funding conditions necessary for the RECIPIENT to comply with applicable law and TAM

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policies. This AGREEMENT consists of additional documents stated in these sections as being attached hereto and incorporated in the AGREEMENT by reference.

SECTION 3. PROJECT DEFINITION AND SCOPE

This AGREEMENT, approved through Resolution 2006-14 of TAM, in accordance with the requirements of TAM's Measure A Expenditure Plan and Strategic Plan, is made for the following purposes identified in the RECIPIENT's Measure A Sales Tax Program Allocation Request Form (Attached):

Local Infrastructure for All Modes

Additional information on project scope is included in the Measure A Sales Tax Program Allocation Request Form.

SECTION 4. GRANT

TAM hereby grants to the RECIPIENT the sum of \$65,997 as designated in Resolution No. 2006-14, approved July 27, 2006, which is included in this AGREEMENT by reference.

SECTION 5. COST ELIGIBILITY

Cost eligibility shall be determined by TAM's Expenditure Plan and Strategic Plan policies. Funds may be used for any local transportation need identified by the RECIPIENT's Public Works Director, including streets and roads projects, local transit projects, bicycle pedestrian projects and other transportation uses, as approved by the RECIPIENT's governing board. Where feasible, locally defined bicycle and pedestrian projects will be implemented in conjunction with a related roadway improvement. This could include safety improvements, pedestrian facilities including disabled access, or bicycle facilities such as bike lanes or signage. and the second of the second

SECTION 6. BUDGET AND SCOPE and a superior with the work of the control of the

RECIPIENT shall maintain a project or program budget. RECIPIENT shall carry out the project and shall incur obligations against and make disbursements of the grant in conformity with TAM's requirements and the budget. The second of th

SECTION 7. PROJECT MANAGEMENT

RECIPIENT shall be responsible for the project and provide management of consultant and contractor activities for which RECIPIENT contracts, including responsibility for schedule, scope, and budget, consistent with TAM's resolution allocating the grant unless otherwise agreed upon in writing. And the Control of th

SECTION 8. PROJECT OVERSIGHT

RECIPIENT shall cooperate with TAM's project management team and shall provide any requested project information.

SECTION 9. ATTRIBUTION AND SIGNAGE

If any portion of grant funds is used for production of reports, acknowledgment of the TAM's role

shall be included in the documents. If any portion of grant funds is used for construction, RECIPIENT shall, upon initiation of field work or at the earliest feasible time thereafter, install and maintain a sign at the construction site identifying Measure A Local Transportation Sales Tax Funds and TAM (e.g., TAM and RECIPIENT's logos — "Your Measure A Sales Tax Dollars at Work"). For non-construction capital purchases funded by any portion of grant funds. RECIPIENT shall affix permanent signage identifying TAM and the Sales Tax Funds as a funding source. RECIPIENT shall demonstrate compliance with attribution and signage requirements as an indispensable condition for authorization of Measure A reimbursement for project expenses. SECTION 10. PRESS RELEASES TO A LIGHT THROUGH THE REST OF A STATE OF THE REST OF THE REST

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RECIPIENT shall notify TAM in advance of any press releases about project and program activities, particularly groundbreakings and ribbon cuttings, in connection to grant funds expended from this AGREEMENT.

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SECTION 11. COMPLIANCE WITH LAW

In the performance of its obligations pursuant to this AGREEMENT, RECIPIENT shall keep itself fully informed of the federal, state and local laws, ordinances and regulations in any manner affecting the performance of this Agreement, and must at all times comply with such laws, ordinances, and regulations as they may be amended from time to time.

SECTION 12. ENVIRONMENTAL COMPLIANCE A CORRECT HONOLOGY OF THE THE THE TO SEE THE SECOND SERVICES OF THE

RECIPIENT shall undertake all environmental mitigation measures that may be identified as commitments in applicable documents (such as environmental assessments, environmental impact statements and reports, and memoranda of agreement) and comply with any conditions imposed as a part of a finding of no significant impact or a record of decision; all such mitigation measures are incorporated in this AGREEMENT by reference. Recipient shall be responsible for obtaining all necessary environmental permits for performance of work. SECTION 13. FINANCES

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All costs charged to the project shall be supported by properly prepared and documented time records, invoices, or vouchers evidencing in detail the nature and propriety of the charges and the basis for the percentage charged to TAM.

SECTION 14. RECORDS

All checks, payrolls, invoices, contracts, vouchers, journal entries, work orders, or other accounting documents pertaining in whole or in part to the project shall be maintained by RECIPIENT for a period of five (5) years after the later of project closeout or termination of grant. Such project documents shall be clearly identified, readily accessible, and, to the extent feasible, kept separate and apart from all other similar documents not pertaining to the project.

SECTION 15. PAYMENT

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TAM shall remit payment to RECIPIENT upon written request by the RECIPIENT after the execution of this AGREEMENT. Payment shall not exceed the schedule shown in the Measure A Sales Tax Program Allocation Request Form - Fiscal Year Cash Flow Availability.

SECTION 16. ELIGIBLE EXPENSES

RECIPIENT shall expend funds only on eligible expenses as follows: operating costs, direct staff time (salary and benefits), consultants; right of way engineering and acquisition costs (including permitting), and competitively bid construction contracts. Indirect costs (as defined by OMB Circular A-87) will not be considered an eligible expense. Funds shall also be expended according to the applicable provisions of the Expenditure Plan and of the Public Utilities Code Section 180000 et seq.

TAM RESOLUTION NO. 2007-16

RESOLUTION OF THE TRANSPORTATION AUTHORITY OF MARIN (TAM) FOR THE ALLOCATION OF \$2,618,904 IN MEASURE A, STRATEGY 3.2, FUNDS TO MARIN COUNTY AND THE CITIES OR TOWNS OF BELVEDERE, CORTE MADERA, FAIRFAX, LARKSPUR, MILL VALLEY, NOVATO, SAN ANSELMO, SAN RAFAEL, SAUSALITO, AND TIBURON

WHEREAS, The voters of Marin County approved the authorization of Measure A at the General Election held on November 2, 2004, thereby authorizing that TAM be given the responsibility to administer the proceeds from a one-half cent transaction and use tax; and

WHEREAS, The duration of the tax will be 20 years from the initial year of collection, which began April 1, 2005, with said tax to terminate on March 31, 2025; and

WHEREAS, The tax proceeds will be used to pay for the programs and projects outlined in TAM's Expenditure Plan; and

WHEREAS, TAM has developed a Strategic Plan to provide guidance on implementing the Expenditure Plan; and

WHEREAS, The Strategic Plan programs Measure A funds over a 20 year period to the four strategies listed in the Expenditure Plan, including Strategy 3.2, Local Infrastructure for all Modes: and

WHEREAS, Measure A funds for Strategy 3.2, Local Infrastructure for all Modes, are programmed under the Strategic Plan to Marin County and the cities or towns of Belvedere, Corte Madera, Fairfax, Larkspur, Mill Valley, Novato, Ross, San Anselmo, San Rafael, Sausalito, and Tiburon for infrastructure improvement projects that are prioritized by the respective Public Works Directors; and

WHEREAS, The Town of Ross is also an eligible recipient, but elected to defer an allocation of Measure A funds until sufficient funds can be accumulated to adequately fund a complete project; and

WHEREAS, Measure A funds for Strategy 3.2 can be used for street and road projects, local transit projects, and bicycle and pedestrian projects.

WHEREAS, Infrastructure improvement projects funded with Measure A funds for Strategy 3.2 will be approved by the County's and Cities' governing boards at public meetings, and

WHEREAS, The project sponsors are requesting funds from Strategy 3.2 that have been accumulated for FY 2006-07; and

WHEREAS, These allocations are consistent with the 2007 Measure A Strategic Plan Update; and

WHEREAS, There are sufficient funds in the Strategy 3.2 line item of the TAM's approved FY 2007-08 budget to cover the proposed action; and

WHEREAS, After reviewing the request in coordination with project sponsors, TAM staff recommended allocating \$2,618,904 in Measure A funds as requested; now, therefore, be it

RESOLVED, That the Transportation Authority of Marin hereby allocates a total of \$2,618,904 in Measure A funds for eligible projects under Strategy 3.2 for FY 2007-09 in the following distributions: \$891,905 for Marin County, \$26,951 for the City of Belvedere, \$78,233 for the Town of Corte Madera, \$76,193 for the Town of Fairfax, \$109,721 for City of Larkspur, \$160,349 for the City of Mill Valley, \$453,427 for the City of Novato, \$126,795 for the Town of San Anselmo, \$533,660 for the City of San Rafael, \$75,274 for the City of Sausalito, and \$86,396 for the Town of Tiburon; and be it further

RESOLVED, That the Transportation Authority of Marin finds the allocations of these funds to be in conformance with the priorities and funding levels established in the Measure A Expenditure Plan and the 2007 Measure A Strategic Plan Update; and be it further

RESOLVED, That the Transportation Authority of Marin hereby authorizes the actual expenditure (cash reimbursement) of funds for these activities to take place subject to the Fiscal Year Cash Flow Distribution Schedule detailed in the attached Allocation Request Forms; and be it further

RESOLVED, That as a condition of this authorization for expenditure, the Executive Director shall impose such terms and conditions as are necessary for the project sponsors to comply with applicable law and adopted Authority policies and execute Funding Agreements with the respective project sponsors to that effect; and be it further

RESOLVED, That as a condition of this authorization for expenditure, the referenced project sponsors shall provide the Authority with any other information it may request regarding the use of the funds hereby authorized.
