**Chuck Donald** appreciated the recommended change in the process for these cell leases.

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Nancy Osborn agreed with Chuck Donald.

Mayor Leone reaffirmed the new process for cell leases, noting that a letter of intent will go out to the cell companies first; the Planning Commission would then review the land use application; and then both the lease and the land use application would return to the City Council for final action.

Councilmember Kelly moved, seconded by Councilmember Weiner, to accept the new procedure for processing cell tower leases as described above. The motion was unanimously approved by a voice vote.

4B2. Bruce Staircase and Encroachment Agreement (DR/EA 08-011): Authorize construction of stairs in the South Street right-of-way and adopt a resolution approving an encroachment agreement to allow a new driveway to encroach into the Sausalito Blvd right-of-way, an existing staircase to encroach in the Marion Avenue right-of-way, and maintenance of landscaping in the Marion Avenue right-of-way moved from Consent Calendar for further discussion

Associate Planner Lilly Schinsing presented the staff report on this item, noting that there were three parts to the project. She further described each, which included: 1) the new driveway encroachment into the Sausalito Boulevard right-of-way; 2) an existing entry staircase encroachment into the Marion Avenue right-of-way; and 3) maintenance of landscaping into the Marion Avenue right-of-way.

## **Public Comment:**

**Dorothy Gibson** spoke about the public stairs and pathways in this area and the importance of some of them.

Charlotte Mastrangelo agreed with Dorothy Gibson and wanted to see the Marion to Sausalito Blvd. stairs developed before the new building plans are approved.

**Stephen Fraser**, attorney for Paula Bruce, noted that this project has taken five years, six planners and three Planning Directors. Mr. Fraser asked the Council to consider conditioning the approval of the lot split so that before the building permit is issued for the new property, a bond to build the stairs would be in place. He also inquired into why Ms Bruce must remove the stairs, some of the patio and chairs, since the Planning Commission has required a fence be built to separate the Bruce property from the Marion Street right-ofway. Mr. Fraser further explained that Ms Bruce is facing financial hardships and noted that such conditions would certainly help.

Mayor Leone explained to Mr. Fraser that he would have to return to the Planning Commission for such changes in conditions.

**Disck Weisinger** again noted that he is in favor of the South Street stairs.
