Appointments to the Citizen's Advisory Review Board

RECOMMENDED MOTION:

Appoint three members to fill the vacancies on the Citizen's Advisory Review Board

SUMMARY & BACKGROUND

The Citizen's Advisory Review Board (CARB) has been without a full board for some time. One vacancy dates back to 2008. One vacancy exists due to that member being appointed to another board. And the final vacancy is due to a member having exceeded their term limits. The latter two members have tried to continue to make themselves available for meetings so that CARB could meet with a quorum present.

Based on an interview schedule adopted earlier by the City Council, on May 4, 2010, Council interviewed four applicants for CARB, two were interviewed on May 18, and the balance this evening.

Council now has the opportunity to seat all, or a part, of the Citizen's Advisory Review Board this evening. Council will need to appoint two members to serve two year terms (ending June 2012), and one members to serve and unexpired term of one year (ending June 2011).

Appointments to the Housing Element Committee

RECOMMENDED MOTION:

Appoint one member to fill the remaining vacancy on the Housing Element Committee

SUMMARY & BACKGROUND

During the later part of 2009, the Community Development Department began the process to update Sausalito's Housing Element. In order to ensure public participation in the process, a nine-member Housing Element Committee was recommended. Immediately appointed to this Committee were two Councilmembers and two Planning Commissioners.

In November, 2009, Council interviewed three applicants: Christopher Visher, Timothy Rempel, and Roberta Maloy. Christopher Visher and Timothy Rempel were the first public members appointed to the Committee.

Since that time, Council has interviewed three additional applicants: Carolyn Kiernet, Joel Paul and Kim Stoddard. Of those applicants, Council appointed Carolyn Kiernet and Joel Paul. A total of eight committee members have been appointed to date.

Since there are two applicants still interested in the one remaining position, Council may either appoint the final committee member, or request that staff continue recruiting.
