Presentation by the San Francisco Veteran's Administration Medical Center on their proposed project at 25 Liberty Ship Way

Due to the absence of those presenting this item, Mayor Leone moved, seconded by Councilmember Weiner, to move this item so that it follows item 6B. The motion was unanimously approved by a voice vote.

6B. Southern Marin Fire – Update on Operations (Fire Chief Jim Irving and Administrative Services Director / Treasurer Charlie Francis)

Fire Chief Jim Irving provided an update on the operations of the Southern Marin Fire District and the Sausalito Fire Department. He noted the following statistics for responses:

Southern Marin Fire: Fires - 63 Rescue/EMS – 1,387 Fire Alarms – 170 Rescue/EMS - 637 Specific to Sausalito: Fires – 21 Fire Alarms – 88

Chief Irving went on to describe how the new stations is being used; noting that he is in that station two days a week, Fire Prevention is there four days a week, and Financial Services is there three days a week. Chief Irving also described how Fire Prevention is working for Sausalito and the District.

Chief Irving concluded his update by describing the contract for services that the District has with the Parks Service.

Council questions followed.

Administrative Services Director / Treasurer Charlie Francis provided information on the fiscal impact of the Fire Consolidation.

Public Comment:

Chuck Donald asked about the duties of a Fire Marshal, as he was concerned about wildlands in the area of his house and the garbage being dumped in the same area from the freeway.

1 2 3	Vicki Nichols asked about the response times and station coverage when the departments are covering calls in the GGNRA.
4 5	Council comments followed.
6 7 8 9	Regarding public workshops on the consolidation, Chuck Donald suggested that small forums be held around town instead of large workshops. He thought that this way questions specific to certain neighborhoods could be asked more easily.
10 11	At 8:35 pm, Mayor Leone called for a ten minute break.
12 13 14	At 8:45 pm Mayor Leone called the meeting back to order and noted that Councilmember Ford had left the meeting due to illness.
15 16	6A. Presentation by the San Francisco Veteran's Administration Medical Center on their proposed project at 25 Liberty Ship Way
17 18 19 20 21 22 23	VA Facility Planner John Pechman and VA Project Engineer Matt Pechman presented a brief overview of the proposed project for 25 Liberty Ship Way. They explained that the current proposal is to demolish the old building and construct a smaller building in its place for medical research. They noted that BCDC had made recommendations on moving some of the parking which had been proposed on the water side of the building.
